

SHINGLE RELEASE FILM

Technical Bulletin #24

Current as of June 2019

Asphalt shingles are manufactured with a factory-applied asphalt adhesive sealant strip. In order to prevent the sealant strip from sticking the shingles together in the package, a release film is embedded on the shingle during the manufacturing process.

The release film is aligned over the sealant strip to prevent the sealant from "sticking" while the shingles are in the bundle. In addition, the sealant on the top shingle in each package is protected

from sticking to wrapper by a special treatment applied in that area of the wrapper.

Once the shingles are unpacked, the release film has served its purpose and should simply be left in place. Release films on the back of asphalt shingles also don't need to be removed.
